Lent 2024

Last Wednesday 14 February, the St Anthony's community celebrated Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent with a Mass at St Alphonsus. The 40 days of Lent is characterised by prayer, alms and fasting, where we prepare ourselves to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. Pope Francis tells us that forty days of Lent is a very special time in the Liturgical Calendar, in which we can 'joyfully embrace a conversion of heart and a turning point that can foster change in each of us.' We all need to improve, for the better. Lent helps us do this.

Thank you to Father Olek for celebrating the Mass and for all who joined us at the Ash Wednesday Mass, this was a beautiful celebration for the School and Parish community.

Jesus lived and preached compassion, love, gentleness, healing, peace, and joy. Modelling the life of Jesus during the season of Lent allows us to demonstrate faith, love and generosity for others who are less fortunate than us. Lent is a time of giving and as a school community during Lent, one of our priorities is to give to those less fortunate than ourselves. One approach we do this is through Project Compassion. Project Compassion is Caritas Australia's annual Lenten fundraising and awareness-fund raising appeal which brings thousands of Australians together in solidarity with the world's poor to help end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity. During 2024 the theme for Project Compassion is 'For all Future Generations.' This theme challenges us to venture into a new experience of compassion and invites us to step up and step out for those who do not have the essential resources they need for their survival. Those whose needs currently are far beyond ours.

This year we invite families to support Project Compassion by donating via the Project Compassion boxes. Your commitment to marginalised people has been a direct response to the Christian call to 'act justly, love mercifully, and walk humbly with our God.'

Numeracy at St Anthony's

During 2024 St Anthony's Maths Priority focuses on implementing tasks focused on reasoning, justification and proving their thinking. In Week 0 the teaching staff engaged in professional learning, exploring research and 'best practice' in terms of teaching Maths. Staff investigated the importance of setting meaningful Learning Intentions and building Success Criteria for lessons alongside of, and with, their students. This work will be followed up with a series of small group professional development sessions, where staff have collaborated to build a shared understanding of effective numeracy strategies and evidence-based resources to support targeted instruction and strategies to implement purposeful numeracy learning. St Anthony's staff will also work with Catholic Education consultants, aiming to foster a great love of Maths in every child!

The Seeds of Student Leadership

This week our Year 6 students have been exploring student leadership and what does a servant student leadership model look like in the school context. This has been a two-day program encompassing leadership approaches, skills, a focus on strategies for making a difference in the lives of others and the development of an action plan for the children's leadership initiatives for 2024. To support the Year 6 students in their leadership formation, they also participated in a Faith Formation Retreat, led by Fr Olek and Ms de Nys, exploring elements of leadership development through the Gospels.

Meet Leaia from Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water was very difficult for Leaia and her family. But, with the support of Caritas Australia, a water tank was installed at their home, improving their health and living conditions.

Meet Memory from Malawi. Memory, the eldest daughter from a rural Malawian family, trained to become a carpenter and is now a trailblazer for future generations of women in her village.

Throughout Project Compassion, you will get to know the stories of Ronita, Leaia and Memory. Journey with them as they forge a path to a brighter future for all generations.

What is Liturgy of the Word for Children?

Liturgy of the Word for Children is similar to Sunday School and occurs during nominated weekend Masses at Millicent Parish. Children are invited to come forward and are escorted to the parish hall by one teacher and an additional adult. During this time, the children listen to the day's Gospel reading, engage in a dialogue about the reading, and participate in a short craft activity.

After this, the children are brought back to Mass for the offertory procession and then return to their families to complete the rest of Mass. This session generally takes 20 minutes and aims to provide a child-friendly way for children to understand the day's readings. Everyone is welcome to attend, and you don't have to be a practising Catholic to bring your children along. If you have any questions, please get in touch with Sharn de Nys. Councellor's Courner

As we find ourselves midway through the fourth week back at school, it's common for children to be feeling tired and possibly anxious amidst this new academic year. Transitioning back into routines after breaks can be tough, and can take a little time getting back into the swing of things. Here are some helpful tips for parents/caregivers and children during this period:

Open Communication: Encourage your child to share their feelings openly, reassuring them that it's normal to feel anxious or tired during this adjustment period.

Establish a Routine: Set up a consistent daily routine with enough sleep, healthy meals, family time, and bedtime stories. Predictability can ease anxiety and help to manage academic and extracurricular activities effectively.

Encourage Self-Care: Teach self-care strategies like deep breathing, mindfulness, and engaging in hobbies for stress relief and relaxation. Check-In with Teachers: Stay connected with teachers to monitor progress and address concerns early, fostering a supportive environment both at home and in school.

Celebrate Achievements: Recognise and celebrate even small accomplishments to boost confidence and motivation.

Be Patient and Supportive: Understand that adjustment takes time, offering unconditional support as they navigate this transition.

Implementing these strategies can help children overcome fatigue and anxiety, ensuring a smoother return to school and fostering a positive learning experience.

Safety Around the School

At the beginning of a new school year, we must remind ourselves about being safe as we drive around the school.

Please drive safely, and we ask families to observe the following requirements and requests:

Drop Zone: Entry to the school drop zone is via a left-hand turn from Salts Street or Emily Street only. To prevent traffic congestion and to ensure traffic flows smoothly, no right-hand turn to enter the Drop Zone from Salts Street is permitted.

School Crossing: A reminder that when the school lights are flashing, all cars should travel at 25km. At all other times, the speed in front of the school is 50km. Your support in this is greatly appreciated.
