Progress Report on the New School Building

The construction of the new building, which includes two stateof-the-art classrooms and a secure, enclosed playground, is progressing smoothly. As we approach the final stages of the project, it's exciting to see the vision coming to life and to share an update with the school community.

This includes the final touches to the building exterior and playground installation. The addition of these new classrooms and the enclosed playground represents a significant enhancement to our school's facilities. The new build will not only provide enhanced Learning Environments but also an enjoyable area for children to play and socialise, fostering their overall development and well-being.

The construction of the new building is well on track, and as we move towards the final stages, the excitement is building within our school community. We look forward to welcoming students and staff into these new spaces and providing them with an enriched educational experience.

- Staff complete certification and undertake regularly updated training in Responding to Abuse and Neglect in Education and Care Settings.
- We also promote strategies to minimise bullying and help students stay safe online.

Safety is Number One

- That no right-hand turn into the school from Salts Street is permitted.

- If in the queue, you keep traffic moving.



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Pentecost

Last Sunday, we celebrated Pentecost. Pentecost is often referred to as the "Birthday of the Church" because it marks the beginning of the Christian community and the empowerment of the early disciples to spread the teachings of Jesus.

According to the Bible, Pentecost occurred 50 days after Easter. The event is described in the New Testament book of Acts, where it is said that the apostles were gathered together in Jerusalem when suddenly, there came a sound like a rushing wind and tongues of fire appeared above their heads. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in different languages, enabling them to communicate with people from various regions and share their love of Jesus with others; hence, the Christian community was born!

Pentecost is important for Catholics and Christians because it signifies that the Holy Spirit is always with us, guiding, empowering, and helping us. When you find yourself in a quiet moment or a situation where you need wisdom, good judgement, understanding or fortitude, try a straightforward but beautiful prayer, **"Come Holy Spirit."** You may be surprised by what happens!



In our last newsletter we discussed what bullying is, compared to other behaviours such as conflict with another person. Today we will look at different types of bullying, and what to do if you're being bullied.

Bullying can be direct (happening to your face) or indirect (happening 'behind your back'), and overt (very obvious and observable) or covert (subtle and hard to prove). There are a few different types of bullying, including:

Cyberbullying - stuff like mean texts, emails, posts, images or videos.

Verbal bullying - using words to make you feel upset, angry, embarrassed, etc. E.g. teasing, name calling, yelling, etc.

Physical bullying - stuff that hurts or harms your body, e.g. kicking, tripping, hitting. Physical bullying can also include things like damaging your possessions.

Social bullying - stuff done to hurt your reputation. It can be verbal, like spreading rumours or playing mean jokes, or non-verbal like pretending not to hear a person when they speak or leaving them out.

I'm being bullied - what should I do?

Stay calm - don't react emotionally (people who bully usually want you to get angry or upset)

Report it - tell trustworthy adults and keep talking to them until the bullying stops; reporting it helps keep people safe (and isn't the same as 'dobbing' which is about getting someone in trouble over nothing)

Get support - bullying can affect your mental health and selfworth - having the support of family, friends, teachers and/or professionals can make a big difference.

Over the next few weeks we will look at some coping mechanisms, and what to do if you are a bystander to someone being bullied.

Remember to approach your child's teacher or staff at our school if you have any concerns for your child's wellbeing.

Are you living with a disability or are you the parent/carer of a child with additional needs? - Then the following information may assist you.

Mission Australia's Mt Gambier office is the local NDIS Partner if the Community - delivering local area coordination (LAC) services to the Limestone Coast region.

We are the face of the NDIS in the community and can assist people aged between 9 and 65 years of age, who are seeking information or access to the NDIS. (for younger children - please see contact information further into the document).

We are here to help you navigate the NDIS pathway and to identify locally based community supports - this includes connections to community groups, sporting clubs, support groups, libraries and schools, as well as providing information about what support is provided by each state and territory government.

We can help you to understand the NDIS, apply and connect with other government and community-based supports.

We will arrange a confidential meeting local to your area, identify community connections which may support you, explore your eligibility and assist you to apply for the NDIS (either for yourself or the child).

If you or the child's NDIS application is rejected, we can also assist you to appeal the decision - if it is your intention to do so.

If you have a child younger than 6 with developmental delay or younger than 9 with disability, you will need to contact Kudos Services, who are the NDIS Early Childhood Partner, covering the Limestone Coast. An early childhood partner can provide supports to children before they apply for the NDIS, and let families know if the NDIS is right for their child. Kudos Services contact details are below:
