Whole School Mass – The Assumption of Mary

St Anthony's Primary School students and staff will celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary Wednesday 14 August during a Whole School Mass, to be held at St Alphonsus Church at 9.15 am. Each year the Assumption of Mary, is a Holy Day of Obligation and in 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith:

"We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory."

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.

This Feast celebrates Mary's relationship of love and faith with God. On this day, Catholics give thanks for the blessed life of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and how God honoured and welcomed her into heaven.

Catholic Saints

This August, we celebrate the Feast Day of three special saints who are connected to our school: St. Alphonsus, St. Mary MacKillop, and St. Clare.

In the Catholic tradition, saints lived exceptional lives, showing great love for God and others. They are now in Heaven and can intercede for us. Saints help us by being role models, inspiring us to live in a way that pleases God. By learning about their lives, we can follow their example. They also act as intercessors, praying for us just like friends would. Additionally, saints are our spiritual friends and companions, offering guidance and support. Saints are not worshipped like God; they are friends in faith who help us on our journey to God, reminding us that we are part of a big family of believers and never alone.

Feast of St Alphonsus

St. Alphonsus's Feast Day is August 1 every year. His story and legacy inspire aspects of St. Anthony's School, which our esteemed Red House team carries forward.

Saint Alphonsus Liguori (1696–1797) was an Italian priest, bishop, and writer. Born near Naples, he started as a lawyer but decided to serve the Church. St. Alphonsus founded the Redemptorists, a group of priests who helped poor people in rural areas. Known for his practical advice on moral issues, he wrote many influential books that influenced Catholic teachings and practices. He was made a saint in 1839 and is the patron saint of those who hear confessions and teach about right and wrong.

Feast of St Mary MacKillop

St. Mary Mackillop's Feast Day is celebrated on August 8 every year. St. Mary MacKillop, born in 1842 in Melbourne, Australia, is renowned for her dedication to education and social justice. She co-founded the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart in Penola, in southeast Australia, establishing numerous schools to provide education for poor and rural children. Her unwavering commitment to helping the marginalized often brought her into conflict with church authorities, yet she remained steadfast in her mission. Canonized in 2010, St. Mary MacKillop is celebrated as Australia's first saint, remembered for her profound faith, resilience, and pioneering spirit in championing the rights of the less fortunate.

Feast of St Clare

St. Clare, our blue team's namesake, is celebrated with a Feast Day on August 12 every year. St. Clare of Assisi was born in 1194 in Assisi, Italy, and was an essential figure in the early 1200s. She was one of the first followers of St. Francis of Assisi and started a group of sisters called the Poor Clares. The Poor Clares lived very simple lives, owning very little and often not even wearing shoes. Clare devoted her life to living humbly and faithfully. She died in 1253 and was made a saint just two years later, in 1255, leaving behind a strong legacy of humility and devotion.

1. Predictability and Security:

- Less Stress: Knowing what to expect each day helps us feel less worried.
- Control: Routines make us feel more in control of our time and actions.

2. Better Health:

- Healthy Habits: Regular routines can include exercise, healthy eating, and good sleep.
- Good Sleep: Going to bed and waking up at the same time every day helps us sleep better.

3. More Productivity:

- Time Management: Routines help us manage our time and get things done.
- Less Procrastination: When tasks become part of our routine, we're less likely to put them off.

Tips for Creating a Routine for yourself and your child:

- Start Small: Begin with simple routines like a regular wakeup time.
- Be Flexible: Adapt your routine when needed, preparing your child if possible.
- Use Tools: Use planners or reminders to keep track.

Creating a simple daily routine can help us all to feel more secure, healthy, and productive.


125 Year Celebrations




SCHOOL PHOTOS ARE TOMORROW. THURSDAY AUGUST 1.

Are you living with a disability or are you the parent/carer of a child with additional needs? – Then the following information may assist you.

Mission Australia's Mt Gambier office is the local NDIS Partner if the Community – delivering local area coordination (LAC) services to the Limestone Coast region.

We are the face of the NDIS in the community and can assist people aged between 9 and 65 years of age, who are seeking information or access to the NDIS. (for younger children – please see contact information further into the document).

We are here to help you navigate the NDIS pathway and to identify locally based community supports - this includes connections to community groups, sporting clubs, support groups, libraries and schools, as well as providing information about what support is provided by each state and territory government.

We can help you to understand the NDIS, apply and connect with other government and community-based supports.

We will arrange a confidential meeting local to your area, identify community connections which may support you, explore your eligibility and assist you to apply for the NDIS (either for yourself or the child).

If you or the child's NDIS application is rejected, we can also assist you to appeal the decision – if it is your intention to do so.

If you have a child younger than 6 with developmental delay or younger than 9 with disability, you will need to contact Kudos Services, who are the NDIS Early Childhood Partner, covering the Limestone Coast. An early childhood partner can provide supports to children before they apply for the NDIS, and let families know if the NDIS is right for their child.
