Care for Creation

In June 2015, Pope Francis wrote a letter, Laudato Si, to the world about caring for our common home: Earth, so that we, as Christians, contribute to resolving the ecological crisis humanity is experiencing. "The ecological crisis thus summons us to a profound spiritual conversion: Christians are called to "an ecological conversion whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them, the environment and with each other. "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue." (Laudato Si, 217).

Later that year, Pope Francis declared 1 September a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, an ecumenical season dedicated to prayer to protect creation and promote sustainable lifestyles. It runs from 1 September to 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. Pope Francis calls us all to celebrate this moment to "reaffirm [our] personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork that he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation."

Communication Protocols

At St Anthony's, we understand that parent/caregiver engagement is essential for student well-being, and productive communication with parents/caregivers is an essential feature of a positive school culture.

Digital technologies have greatly assisted in this regard, and using parent/caregiver information apps, social media, the school website, Seesaw, and School Stream to communicate directly with staff is now routine.

We appreciate that parent/caregiver expectations regarding staff accessibility have evolved in the context of enhanced digital communication practices. While representing efficient modes of communication, the breadth of digital communication options can create 'availability creep', where school employees become more accessible in locations and at times of the day, weekends, and during periods of leave when they should be able to disconnect from work. Indeed, recent laws have taken effect that provide school employees with the right to disconnect.

In the interest of respecting the rights of our staff and recognising the importance of facilitating and promoting healthy communication, please note the following as standard protocol during term time:

- Noting that our staff spend a significant amount of their workday focusing on teaching or other activities applicable to their roles, staff will endeavour to respond to Parent/caregiver communications within 48 hours. Staff will discern whether an urgent matter requires a shorter response timeframe.
- Parents and caregivers are encouraged to contact the school's office in the first instance for general information and enquiries.

We thank parents/caregivers for their support in this matter.
